BCF Welcomes Four New Scholarships

Bring on **FOUR MORE!** The Berrien Community Foundation awarded more than \$130,000 in student scholarships including four newly established scholarship programs at the annual scholarship celebration in June. The new scholarships included The All God's Children Community Choir Scholarship, The Insurance Management Services Scholarship for Benton Harbor Football, The Miller Journalism Scholarship and Powered By Honor Scholarships.

A special highlight of the event was hearing from Faith Keathley, the 2001 winner of the Carol A.

Oehlaffen Youth in Philanthropy Scholarship. "Always be humble and kind,"

Keathley said. She spoke about how the lessons she learned while participating in philanthropy with the Berrien Community Foundation Youth Advisory Committee were as valuable as the scholarship that helped her earn a degree at Ferris State University.

"For some students, these scholarships mean the difference between going to school and taking time off to work," said Berrien Community Foundation

President Lisa Cripps-Downey. "For others the scholarship provides a vote of confidence that they can succeed in school."

Berrien Springs High School graduate Morgan Coulston was the winner of the newly established Ronald H. Miller Journalism Scholarship and a speaker at the scholarship celebration.

"Receiving this scholarship gave me confidence," Coulston told the audience of more than 140 donors, recipients and family members. "I have received a lot more than just a scholarship, I have received plans for my life and for that, I thank you."

BCF Grant Funds “No Hungry Senior” program



The wait is over for many Berrien County seniors. Senior Nutrition Service - Meals on Wheels is happy to report they have not needed a waitlist since receiving a \$10,000 grant from the Berrien Community Foundation last fall. Meals on Wheels provides hot meals as well as warm smiles and wellness checks for homebound seniors in Berrien County. These hot meals and visits

can be the difference between living at home vs. living in an assisted living facility and, in some cases, can be the difference between life and death.

Last year, demand for meal delivery for homebound seniors increased 45% from the previous year. By implementing the “No Senior Hungry in Berrien County” program in December, they have eliminated the need for a waitlist and served over 33,000 meals during this time. This represents meals to more than 300 hungry seniors.



In addition to the hot meals, the Meals on Wheels drivers provide a welcome visit and wellness check for their clients. “These drivers, over time, really begin to know the people they are delivering to,” said Executive Director Linda Strohl. “They know who always comes to the door right away and who needs a bit of rousing to get to the door.” Strohl remembered a driver who delivered meals to a woman who usually answered the door right away. He knocked and knocked on the door but no one came to the door. When the driver was unable to reach the emergency contact for the woman, 9-1-1 was called. Police came and found the woman had fallen and was unable to get up or yell loud enough to be heard. In this case, the wellness check became just as important as the food itself.
