BCF Awards \$368,000 in Scholarships

It was a record-setting year for the Berrien Community Scholarship program as a total of \$368,000 in scholarships were awarded to area students. The scholarships support graduating seniors, adults returning to school and current college students.

This year six new scholarships were added to the BCF family of scholarships: **Delta Kappa Gamma Rho Chapter Women in Education Scholarship,** The Patrick Freehling Memorial Scholarship, The **Patricia Gagliardo Kutz-Holland Trades** Scholarship, Jean M. Heisner Medical Technician Scholarship, Maybury Scholarship and Wilson Family Scholarship. To date, more than \$3.5 million has been awarded in scholarships since the scholarship program began.

"For some students, a scholarship can make the difference between whether or not they go to college," said Berrien Community Foundation President Lisa Cripps-Downey. "This year, we are awarding more money to more students than ever before. BCF and our generous donors are excited

to help these students be more financially secure as they hit this milestone in life and help offset the cost of college."
