\$500,000 Trefz Family Scholarship Announced at BCF

Students all over Berrien County who need help paying for college will have the opportunity to apply for a scholarship through the newly-established **Trefz Family Scholarship Fund.**

"This is such a great story of how Josephine Trefz took the opportunity to care for this community and provide for others something that she always wanted – a college education," said BCF President Lisa Cripps-Downey.

Josephine and Richard Trefz purchased 17 acres of beach front property in 1953 for \$7,500. Together, they worked and built their home on the property. They lived very simply. Josephine worked as a secretary at V-M Corporation in Benton Harbor and Richard worked at the Studebaker plant in South Bend.

In 1968, they sold the land to Lincoln Township for \$45,000. That land became part of what we now know as Lincoln Township Park. It was combined with another parcel to create the park which

is now over 34 acres with more than 400 feet of public lake front access.

"I love the idea that this gift provided both a space so many people enjoy through Lincoln Township Beach and then went on to build a scholarship fund," Cripps-Downey said.

According to family members, Josephine and Richard invested the \$45,000 for retirement. In 1997, Josephine used the investment to establish a trust that would help take care of her and her siblings during their lifetimes and, upon their deaths, the remainder would be distributed, predominantly to form the scholarship fund at the Berrien Community Foundation. Josephine's three siblings had all gone to college and it was something she would have wanted for herself, according to her nephew. Though she never went to college, many students will have the opportunity through this fund.

"A land purchase that first helped create a public park for all of us to enjoy now becomes a \$500,000 scholarship endowment to support approximately \$20,000 in scholarships each year for low-income students in Berrien County through the Trefz Family Scholarship Fund," Cripps-Downey said. "What a beautiful gift."
