What will residents receive in the mail?

- **Green** areas receive a **paper survey** in the first mailing.

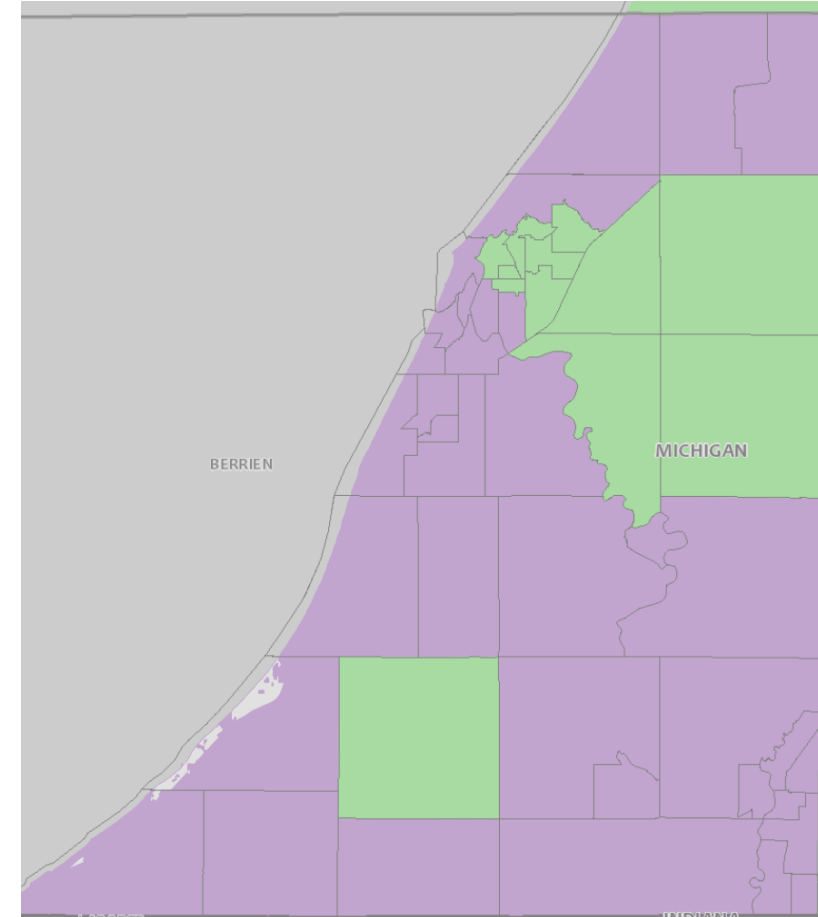

What does the Census ask?

- Name of each person in household
- Does person live/stay somewhere else? (student, military, etc.)
- Age
- Date of Birth
- Sex
- Ethnicity (Hispanic, Latino or Spanish Origin)
- Race
- Relationship (to person completing the form)
- Own or Rent
- Phone Number

Who should be counted?

Count everyone living under your roof on April 1, 2020

- Family members and friends living or sleeping there most of the time
- Children of all ages
 - Newborn babies, even those born on April 1 or who are still in the hospital on April 1
 - Foster children, grandchildren, nieces, nephews, children of friends (even if they are living with you temporarily)
 - Children who split their time between homes if they are living with you on April 1, 2020
- College students
 - Count college students living at home
 - If college students live away from home, they are counted at the on or off campus residence where they live and sleep most of the time.
 - U.S. college students who are living and attending college outside the U.S. are not counted in the U.S.

Count everyone living under your roof on April 1, 2020

- Roommates
- Someone who is staying in your home on April 1 and has no usual home elsewhere
- Anyone who is renting a space in your home
- Citizens of foreign countries who are living in the U.S. should be counted (green card holders, legal and illegal immigrants)
- Foreign students living and attending college in the U.S. should be counted where they live and sleep most of the time.
- Military personnel
 - If temporarily deployed overseas, count at their usual home address in the U.S.
 - If living in housing units, barracks, military campgrounds, etc. count where they live.

Other circumstances

- Patients
 - In hospitals and in-patient hospice facilities should be counted at the residence where they live and stay most of the time.
 - Those counted at a health care facility include:
 - Those with no usual home
 - People in psychiatric hospitals or units for long-term
 - People in nursing facilities
- Homeless individuals can be counted using the online form or the phone.
- Visitors should be counted in the place where they live and sleep most of the time (not at your home).
- People in shelters that provide sleeping facilities are counted at the shelter.
- People in prisons and correctional facilities on April 1 are counted in those facilities.

Do's

- Start at: my2020census.gov
- Let residents use the computer to complete the form on their own if they are comfortable. Provide privacy but encourage them to ask you questions.
- Give information so they can make the decision. (Example: My nephew is living with me. Should I count him? Your answer: If that's where your nephew lives and stays most of the time, then you should count him. If he doesn't have a regular home such as a couch surfer, then you should count him. If he stays with you once in a while, then he should be counted at where he lives most of the time.)
- Be sure they click "SUBMIT QUESTIONNAIRE." Then, go back to the home page for the next person.

Don'ts

- Don't answer for them.
- Don't read their answers. If you happen to see them or need to help due to ability to understand the questions, don't share the information with anyone.
- Don't provide a gift card or food for completing the Census. Do provide a gift card or food or other incentive for attending an event.

What does the Census look like? Paper Version

Start here OR go online at [url removed] to complete your 2020 Census questionnaire.
Use a blue or black pen.

Before you answer Question 1, count the people living in this house, apartment, or mobile home using our guidelines.

- Count all people, including babies, who live and sleep here most of the time.

The census must also include people without a permanent place to live, so:

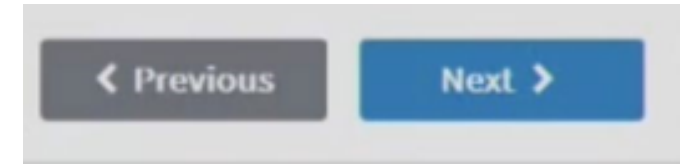

- Use latest versions of Chrome, Firefox, Internet Explorer or Safari. Enable cookies.
- In the survey, use the PREVIOUS and NEXT buttons instead of the browser back button.
 - If you use the browser back button, you're likely to have to start the survey over.



- The form must be completed in one sitting.
If there is no activity for 13 minutes, a reminder will pop up to complete the form.
If there is no activity for 15 minutes, the session will end, and the respondent will have to start from the beginning.
If this happens, log in again and complete the form.

It's best to use the unique ID code in the letter. It is possible to complete the Census without the ID code.

- For people with more than one place to live, count them at the place where they sleep most of the time.
- For people who will be moving from one residence to another, count them at the residence where they will be living on April 1, 2020.
- For people who do not have a usual residence, or who cannot determine a usual residence, count them where they will be staying on April 1, 2020.


Using those guidelines, be sure to INCLUDE the following types of people if they will be living or staying at 1307 BARNARD DR Sim Data ZZ 89102 1805 most of the time around April 1, 2020:

- Babies and children of all ages (even newborns and infants), including biological, step, and adopted children, as well as grandchildren, foster children, and children in joint custody arrangements.


